BW Lakeside

Weather and Fishing Conditions - May 1st to 28th



The start of May brought bright and clear weather with predominantly steady North Easterly breezes, perfect for consistent drifting conditions across the lakes although not the most condusive to fly fishing! Mornings and evenings have been the most productive as expected.

Although bright sunshine dominated much of the period, it didn't stop anglers from putting in some fantastic catch returns. Chew in particular saw high activity on the eastern side, with hotspots stretching from Hollow Brook to Moreton Bank. The NE wind allowed for drifts from Hollow Brook to Wick Green, where many anglers reported successful sessions.

Buzzer hatches continued in strong numbers, with floating and tip lines proving to be the most effective approach throughout.

We saw some unsettled conditions towards the end of the month with changeable wind and some rain, this coincided with the fish moving into slightly deeper water. Woodford, Walley, the Sailing club and the Cages have all started to produce.

Nunnery has also been productive for our bank anglers.

Chew Valley Lake:

Fish Caught:

- Top Patterns: Small buzzers, Muskins and Diawls on a floating or midge tip line. The most productive was a 3 or 4 foot slow tip line. Another popular method was to use a Di3 line with Blobs and Boobies on a fast retrieval to target some of the more recently stocked fish.
- Best Areas: Hollow brook to Moreton Bank.

The 2025 BRFFA Open was held under largely favourable spring conditions at Chew Valley Lake on Sunday 5th May. Anglers were greeted with a light morning breeze and temperatures ranging from 15–19°C, with the wind gradually increasing throughout the day. These conditions created an ideal setting for a competitive and memorable match. As the event unfolded, it quickly became evident that Chew's hard-fighting trout were in peak form, delivering thrilling, arm-wrenching sport throughout. The hotspots this year proved to be Spring Bay and the area off Wick, where anglers found success using static presentations of nymphs and buzzers on floating and tip lines.

Emerging at the top of a strong and competitive field was Mark Miles, who demonstrated outstanding skill and composure to secure the BRFFA Open title and the £1,000 cash prize. His performance was a testament to consistent, top-tier angling in challenging yet rewarding conditions.

It was especially heartening to see youth representation in the competition, with three junior anglers taking part. Leading the charge was Will Wellman, who landed five quality trout and earned the top junior title while finishing an impressive 14th overall.

AIRFLO Celtic League 4th May

Chew Valley Lake played host to the second round of the 2025 Airflo Celtic League on Sunday 4th May, welcoming teams from across the country for what turned out to be another exciting and highly competitive day of fly fishing.

Under clear spring conditions, anglers faced a challenging day with bright skies and changeable pressure, yet Chew's renowned quality trout ensured there was still plenty of action across the water. Despite the testing nature of the day, there were some excellent performances both at team and individual level.

Team Tightlines once again demonstrated their consistency and strength as a unit, securing the top team position for Round 2 with another solid all-round performance. Their ability to work effectively as a team and maximise opportunities throughout the day kept them at the top of the leaderboard.

Individually, it was Graham Currie of Team Snowbee who led the way with a fantastic effort, bringing nine fish to the boat to secure the top angler position on the day. His result was especially impressive considering the conditions and sets a high standard moving into the rest of the league.

Evening League:

The Bristol water evening league takes place every other Tuesday and is fished for the last four hours of the day this informal catch and release match is fished with unweighted, comp legal, barbless flies and floating or tip lines.

We have seen the evening league go from strength to strength over the past few months with Graham Currie now at the helm carrying on from Andy Stones great work!

May 6th

On the 6th we saw 26 anglers compete on Chew. The conditions on the evening where light winds coming from the North east with bright sun.

Despite the less than favourable wind direction fish were caught from the off with the first fish falling to organiser Graham Currie just 20 minutes after leaving the jetty!

61 fish were caught in total giving us a rod average of 2.34 over the four hours.

Graham Currie landing a very impressive 11 fish for 1st place, followed by Adam Drescher with 8 fish taking second and Paul Roach showing his ever-consistent ability bringing 6 to the boat.

No standout method unfortunately this week as Graham was fishing a 4ft tip line with a team of Diawl Bach nymphs, Adam favoured a 3ft tip and washing line with most of his fishing coming to his point fly in the shape of a Foam Daddy and Paul chopping and changing between the Washing line and the Bung!

Location for most boats was a long drift from the East shore towards Wick.

May 20th

The next evening league match took place on the 20th of May with 24 anglers taking to the water. Chew was the host again but in similarly poor conditions. The wind started off from the East with bright Sun, most boats ventured straight to the Dam before a sudden wind change and little action sent the boats scattering in all directions looking for a change of luck!

The evening turned into a real grueler, with only 12 fish falling to 24 rods. Come 8:00pm most where ready to retire to the comfort of the Stoke!

Pete Yarrow managed to land 3 which this week was enough to take 1^{st} place, closely followed by his boat partner Gordon Smith in 2^{nd} with 2 fish. 3^{rd} was tight as 7 other anglers had caught meaning times

had to be reviewed; Robin parker had it landing his fish at 18.55 and Cole Bowden narrowly missing out on a place on the podium by just 11 minutes!

Methods seemed to be clearer cut this week with a floating line and washing line set up utilising a booby on the point seemed to be the way to go!

The next evening league will take place on Blagdon and run from 5:00pm-9:00pm if anyone wishes to take part in this great informal and relaxed competition you can express your interest to the Lodge and we can put you in contact with Graham.

Winners of each section win a complementary mid-week boat ticket courtesy of Bristol water, along with those all-important league points!

Blagdon Lake

Fish Caught:

- Top Patterns: Much Like Chew Muskins Dwials and Buzzers seemed to be the mainstay for May, although dropping down to size 12 or even 14s seemed to produce when the fish were proving difficult! The fish seemed to want the flies almost static so Muskins or light weigh buzzers seemed to out fish the much heavier epoxy buzzers as they would descend slowly through the water. The addition of a buoyant point fly to hold things up in the layers was often key. Floating lines or 3ft tips ensured the flies didn't fall to quickly.
- **Best Areas:** Pegs, Rugmore and Wood bay continued to be productive for both bank and boat anglers. The Boats also had good success around the spit in front of the lodge. As the month pushed on the fish have moved into deeper water with the Dam and Cheddar water starting to produce.


Alan Furguson has confirmed the rumours that a true Blagdon behemoth was landed in the shape of this 38lb specimen a real catch of a life time!

- Top Patterns: A small black booby fished slowly on a sinking line has scored well in the brighter conditions. In lower light levels the fish will often come up in the water, requiring a change to the washing line and dries. Namely Bobs bits and carrot flies. A top tip from our resident "Tanks Guru" Bernie Weaver is to impart some movement into your dries. Thanks for the image, Bernie.
- Best Areas: The road bank of Tank 2 and the pipe of 3
- Rod Averages: 2.39
